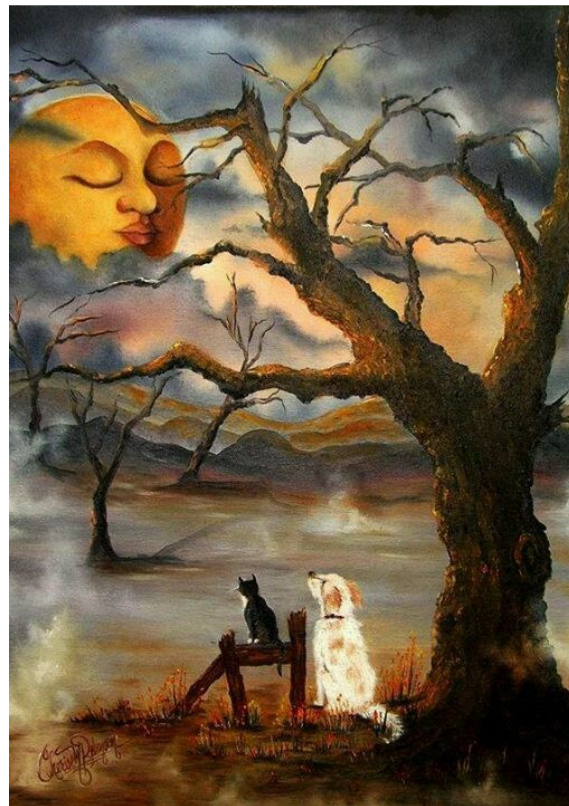
Rabies is a virus that is transmitted by contact with the saliva of an infected animal, usually through a bite. Once bitten, the virus travels along the nerves of the victim going to the spinal cord and then up to the brain. All warm blooded mammals, including humans, can contract rabies, there is no cure and the disease is always fatal.

In the USA we have procedures and laws in place to reduce the rate of rabies fatalities. By law, all dogs are required to get a rabies vaccination with additional boosters of the vaccine on a specific schedule. All states require the vaccination be administered by a veterinarian who will provide you with certification verifying your little doxie has been vaccinated, usually a metal tag and a paper certificate.

If there is any suspicion that your little doxie has been exposed to rabies he will be put in quarantine for a minimum for ten days. Under certain circumstances this can include vaccinated dogs. But, in the most severe situation, following specific legal protocol, the officials might make the decision to euthanize a dog in order to conduct medical testing for verification of the rabies virus. Local officials monitor all dogs that are under quarantine. **VACCINATE!!!!**
